The Ole Miss' blademen won 15 of the 20 point-scoring races and shared victory in a 16th, to compile 182 points. Balmy Beach, with no victories, finished second, with 63 points. West Rouge had one victory and 48 points; Toronto Sailing and Cance Club took two wins and 34 points; and Burlington's Mohawk CC shares the cance singles win with Mississauga and earned 32 points.

The Port Credit paddlers swept all four juvenile races, won six of seven junior events, five other senior races and the bantam canoe fours, the only bantam race for which points are given.

Oldershaw emerged as the winningest paddier. He tied with Mohawk's Bill Pitt at the finish line of the senior canoe singles. He and Hickox won the tandems and were joined by Reardon and Osborne for the fours victory. All were in the 1,000-metre and open war canoes steered by Bill Collins. Bell and Burkimsher, along with Mark Butler and Hans Nischan won the kayak fours. Torontos' Gabor Joo again won the kayak singles, in which he has been unbeatable for years. West Rouge's John Mitchell and John McCormick combined for a win in the kavak tandems.
