With John Knight, he won the junior kayak pairs; then teamed with Joe Green for a victory in the senior canoe pairs. He and Green, along with Russ Dunn and Charles Kurtz, were out front in the senior canoe fours race. Dunn climaxed a long try, stretching over several seasons, by winning the junior canoe singles.

Another Beach pair — Claus Ahlberg and Dave Deveaux — won the juvenile canoe pairs and, with John Crone and Phil Redwood, were first in the canoe fours.

Gabor Joo, unfortunately unavailable for the Olympics because of lack of citizenship, continued his dominance in the senior kayaks. He won the singles and paired with Lloyd Rice to annex the pairs for TS&CC.
