In June, Kristi Gauthier, Tory Tuttle, Ian Mortimer and Angus Mortimer were members of the Canadian team competing in the prestigious Duisberg, Germany world cup international regatta. 80 countries were represented. Germany won the regatta 456 points, Poland 425, Canada 317. The best showing ever for Canada at this regatta. Olympic champion Adam van Koeverden, Burloak, earned a fourth World Cup win this year winning gold in K-1 500m and 1000m.

Karen Furneaux, Cheema won K-1 200m and bronze in K-1 500m. Attila and Tamas Buday Jr. Missy won C-2 1000m. Ian Mortimer and Richard Dalton Cheema, were 8th in C-2 500m and 8th in 200m. Ian and Kyle Jeffrey Missy, were 9th in C-2 1000m. In the B final, Angus Mortimer was 5th in K-1 1000m, Kristi and Tory were 5th in the B final over 500m. and were 9th in the A final in K-4 500m

Six Rideau paddlers compete in Duisberg

After national team trials at the Olympic Basin, six Rideau paddlers represented Canada at a World Cup Regatta in Duisberg, Germany. 50 countries entered crews and were allowed two entries per event.

Ian Mortimer (canoe) recorded two 8th place and two 9th place finished in C-2 and C-4 races in A finals. (9 crews).

Angus Mortimer (kayak) was fifth in mens K-1 1000m in B final.

Tory Tuttle and Kristi Gauthier were 5th in K-2 500m in B final.

Corey Hamilton and Rhys Hill raced mens K-2 and reached the semi-finals.
